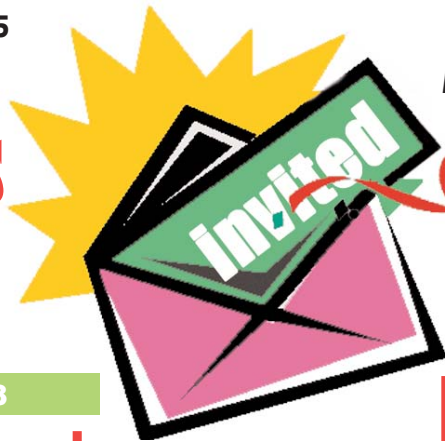

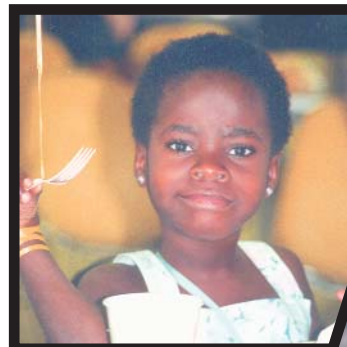

The Goose Hollow Family Shelter provides a special opportunity to volunteer in First Church's response to homelessness in our area...GHFS is a temporary emergency shelter set up at First United Methodist Church in 1994. SUNDAY SCHOOL FOR YOUTH

Sunday School is devoted to learning grounded in scripture and intended to help youth have a deeper faith. In all levels of education, we use the Wesleyan Quadrilateral and the Bible to explore the building blocks of discipleship, faith, stewardship, social justice, decision-making, mission, spiritual formation and caring skills.

6th-8th Grade
