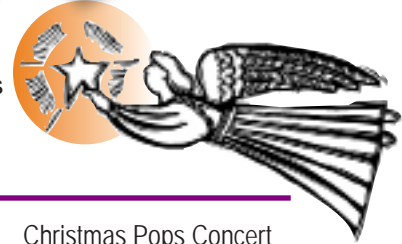

*Janet Richards*, on the death of her mother, *Mavis Rood*, who died in Coos Bay, OR on December 11, 2010 at age 93.

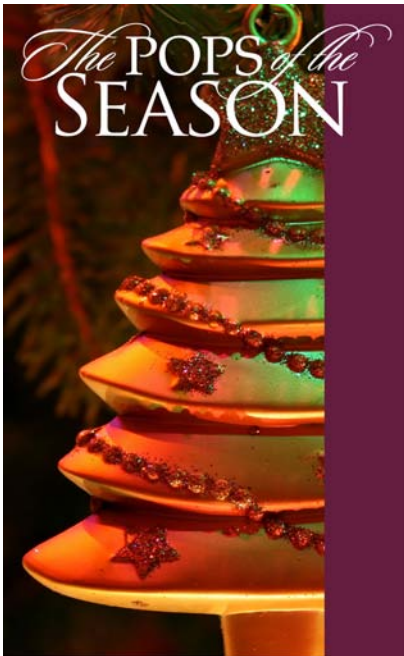

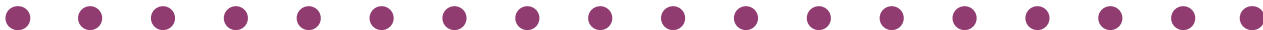
