Paul Adams is the recipient of the **Guy Wheaton Award** for exemplary service within this congregation. Paul went to the top of the list for his consistency of service, his willingness to go the extra mile, and for literally hundreds of hours of work on behalf of this congregation.

Last October Paul shared a vision with Rev. Donna of a newly designed church website, and then rose to the challenge when she suggested a launch of the new site in time for Advent, just four weeks away!

Since then Paul has kept daily watch on the website, has trained all of the committee chairpersons to keep news current, and has very capably served as our official web manager. We give thanks to God for Paul's creativity, inspiration, technical expertise, and extraordinary communication skills.



Schools of Christian Mission: "That All May Have Life"

An opportunity to enjoy a shot-in-the arm study time that will inspire, educate, and recharge your batteries, that's Oregon Schools of Christian Mission at George Fox University in Newberg, Oregon, July 11 - 15. There will be three specific studies:

Immigration in the Bible shares the story of the Bible as a narrative of immigration and migration.

Haiti: Challenges and Hope highlights the numerous cultures and the legacy of colonialism that have shaped Haiti's cultural heritage and history.

Poverty helps participants recognize and claim the connections between Scripture, church tradition, compassion for the poor and social outreach and justice.

Schools of Christian Mission were begun in the mid 1930s by the Women's Home Missionary Society. Today, more than 20,000 women and men and youth participate in the annual SOCM around the world. These schools are held each summer in every United Methodist Conference.

Staff Changes Are Here

New Minister of Discipleship

Welcome Jeremy Smith! Our new Minister of Discipleship joins us July 1st.

Rev. Smith grew up in Oklahoma. He earned a Master of Divinity from Boston University School of Theology. Commissioned in 2006 and ordained in 2010, Jeremy has pastored churches for the past six years in Boston and in Oklahoma.

Jeremy was the Social Media Manager for the Reconciling Ministries Network at General Conference 2012.

Jeremy and Chelsea Paxton, his partner, met at Boston University, where she earned a Master of Theological Studies; they married in 2006. Their family currently includes a cat, Tegan, and they are expecting a baby girl in early October.

New Minister of Pastoral Care

The Rev. Dick Storment will be our new Minister of Pastoral Care. We will welcome him at our July 15th worship service.

Dick will be assuming the role from which Tom Foster is retiring — giving special attention to those in our congregation who are hospitalized, home bound, in nursing homes, or who have special need as well as staffing our Stephen Ministry. This position is a ½ time role assisting our other pastors serve the congregation.

Rev. Storment comes with special training in Clinical Pastoral Education in hospital settings.

Dick and his wife, Sally, are both members of the Yellowstone Annual Conference where they served as pastors for many years. They are retiring to Scappoose in order to be close to their daughter.

"first fruits" - strategic planning for 2012 and beyond —

You may be aware that the Parish Conference and the Ministry Conference of First Church, under the direction of the Rev. Dana Brown (an organizational consultant for non-profits in the Portland area), has begun a process to identify 3 to 5 priority goals for our use in the next 5 to 8 years.

Change is happening around us and to us. For instance, in the last ten years, FUMC has lost 16% of its members. Currently our membership stands at 806. If this trend continues, ten years from now, our membership would be 677, and in 20 years we would have only 57% of the membership we had in 2005.

Our worship attendance has declined 20% in ten years. Currently we average 342 in worship each week. If this trend continues, we'll see only 266 in worship in 2022. In the last four years we have lost 14% of our pledging units.

Currently we need an average pledge of \$2,929 from 292 pledgers in order to meet our \$855,331 budget. If this trend continues, we'll need an average pledge of \$4,255 from 201 pledgers in 2022 in order to meet today's budget.

But don't panic! God's Holy Spirit is alive and well here at First Church, and there is much for us to celebrate in our varied ministries of music and worship, Sunday School, missions, outreach, etc. And, we can seize this moment to strategize together about a future filled with hope, to imagine some bold changes which will lead to growth.

A leadership retreat is planned for Saturday, July 28 from 8:00 am to 12:30 pm in the Fireside Room. Anyone is welcome to attend, while Ministry and Parish Conference members are particularly expected to participate. At the retreat we will identify our priorities for 1st Church ministry in the next few years. Following the August Parish Conference meeting you can discuss the stated priorities at one of these times: Sunday, August 19th from 9:00 to 10:15 am; or Sunday, August 26 from 11:45-1:00 pm. We will approve the goals at an All Church Conference after worship on Sunday, Sept. 9.
